

Presentation of the villages in General Toshevo municipality

The village of Krasen

The village of Krasen is 20km. from the town of General Toshevo. The village is in the Natura 2000 area and is adjacent to the Dryan Dam and the protected areas of Rositsa - Loznitsa and Izvorovo - Kraishte.

Conditions for cultural, rural and ecotourism tourism:

- Availability of welcoming and well-furnished country houses - 10 separate rooms.
- Ethnographic collection
- The complex of "Brothers Alexievi" Ltd., located in a picturesque area, with a guest house - 5 separate rooms, a tavern, an outdoor agricultural exhibition, a farm yard, an equestrian center.
- A restaurant in the Philip's Tavern / restored in 2009 / related to the work of the renowned Bulgarian writer Yordan Yovkov.
- Camping with newly built wooden prefabricated houses - 20 seats.
- Folklore groups and everyday attractions.

Cultural-historical heritage:

- The village of Krasen is closely connected with the life and work of the famous Bulgarian writer Yordan Yovkov, who taught in the village, founded a secondary school - now a cultural monument known as the Yovkov School.

The village of Kardam

The village is located 5 km from the Bulgarian-Romanian border. The distance to the town of General Toshevo is about 8 km.

The village Kardam is in the Natura 2000 area and is located in the areas of the protected areas and territories "Kraimorska Dobrudja" and "Kardam".

Excellent conditions for rural tourism: availability of welcoming and well-furnished country houses and farm yards; well-developed communications and infrastructure.

Near Kardam is the place where the farmstead was located near the border, about which writer Jordan Yovkov wrote. Yovkov's parents (named after the writer) are buried in Yovkov's parents. In the rural church in 1909 the poetess Dora Gabe married.

The village of Spasovo

The village of Spasovo is 28 km away. from General Toshevo Municipal Center, 20 km. from the beach and 7 km. south of the border with Romania. S. Spasovo is located in the area of the protected areas and territories "Kraimorska Dobrudja" and "Bezhanovo".

Landmarks:

The settlement in the area of the village of Spasovo is from the earliest Thracian times - the Bronze Age. Roman coins (VI c.) were found in the area of the Thracian mound in the western part of the village.

20 km from Spasovo lies the Durankulak Lake, which is a nature reserve and offers unique opportunities for fishing, sightseeing and recreation amidst the beauty of untouched nature. The area of the lake is a natural habitat for many protected bird species, making it an attractive destination for lovers of ornithology.

The village of Vasilevo

The village of Vasilevo is 20 km away. from General Toshevo and 20 km. from the seashore. The village of Vasilevo is located in the area of Kraimorska Dobrudja protected area. In the immediate vicinity of the village is a picturesque forest surrounded by rocky hills.

Excellent conditions for rural tourism: availability of welcoming and well-furnished country houses and farm yards; well-developed communications and infrastructure. At about 1.5 km. from the present borders of Vasilevo can be seen the remains of a Roman fortress from the 3-4th century, which was later used by the ancient Bulgarians.

The village of Preselemtsi

The village of Preselemtsi is 15 km away. from General Toshevo and 25 km. from the seashore. It is located in the area of Kraimorska Dobrudja Protected Area.

Preselemtsi is one of the few strongholds from the First Bulgarian State. It was officially dated to the 9th-10th centuries. During the excavations numerous coins, ornaments, buckles, spearheads and arrows, and ceramic remains were found. A bronze statuette of Heracles was also found here. This find proves that life in these places existed even in the Roman era / I - IV century AD /.

The village of Dubovik

The Dora Gabe Memorial Exhibition, part of the General Toshevo History Museum, is housed in the community center building in the village of Dubovik. It contains unique personal belongings of the great Bulgarian poet and numerous photographs. Near the home of Dora Gabe's home is a group of centuries-old oaks designated as protected areas. There is also a guest house in the village.
